We find ourselves in a remarkable moment in global environmental governance. China is actively promoting green development on the global stage, while the US under Trump has rejected the Paris Agreement and actively opposed the development of renewable energy and electric vehicles. Prof. Alex Wang's talk will examine how China came to embrace green development and the ways in which China promotes a developmental form of environmentalism through tools of green ideology, diplomacy, economic statecraft, and international development cooperation. China's approach promises to reinforce certain global norms, while reshaping others in ways that exacerbate geopolitical tensions.

This event will also mark the installation of Prof. Wang as the holder of the Walter & Shirley Wang Endowed Chair in U.S.-China Relations & Communications.
